## **SAFE Stations Lessons Learned**

## Harm Reduction / Prevention:

- Town Hall Meetings
  - Having treatment, prevention, and education resources available on site.
- Narcan
  - Multiple doses to be handed out if fentanyl is in your community
- Fentanyl Test Strips
  - Hand out multiple test strips
  - Education is needed
  - Expect some negative reactions from community
- Community Paramedic
  - Data, Data, Data ---no detail is too small. Don't know what we don't know until we realized we needed it
  - Crew level documentation adequate at best
- ODMAP
  - It's best if multiple jurisdictions are entering in the data
  - Ok, now we have data, what are we going to do with it?
  - Do we want to be reactive or proactive

## Actual Intake Site and Programming of SAFE Stations:

- Build it and they will come
  - Ability to handle capacity
  - Need multiple treatment partners
  - 24/7 crisis intake capabilities
  - Have plan in place when ALL referral partners are full
  - Have ability to collect and legally (properly) dispose of illicit drug and paraphernalia
  - Have ability to handle an acute psychosis incident
  - Have ability to handle polysubstance
  - Consider usage of in car cameras for protection of crew and patient
  - Couples/Friends/Family seeking treatment at the same time
  - Have plan in place for on-site overdose
  - Bus passes
- Does patient have:
  - ID
- Citizenship?
- Insurance
  - Private
  - Medicaid (who manages it)
- Still working with a Union
  - Attempted expansion to use peer supporter, not well received.
  - NOT EVERYONE WILL BE ON BOARD, and that's ok
- You will have repeat clients
  - The only requirement to get into treatment is to be alive.
- Care packages to take to treatment (personal hygiene)
- Resources for Families
  - The Addicts Parents United (TAP United)
  - Prevention Action Alliance
  - Annie Highwater

## Barriers to Overcome at Fire Station or Jurisdiction:

- True understanding of the science of addiction

- Exposure to the recovery community
  Stigma of drug addiction
  Identification of the health of the organization
- The more tenure, the greater the rank, the more influence
- Financial capabilities
- Political support of addiction prevention, harm reduction, education practices
- Relationship with law enforcement partners Vicarious trauma and PTSD
- Compassion fatigue
