

# Overdose Fatality Review Data System

## Version 2.0 Overview

### Implementation

Overdose fatality review (OFr) is being used by a growing number of communities to strengthen their responses to the overdose epidemic.

To assist local communities in storing OFr data and monitoring recommendations, the Bureau of Justice Assistance and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention—in partnership with the Institute for Intergovernmental Research (IIR), epidemiologists, researchers, and local OFr practice professionals—started developing a secure, standardized data system in August 2019.

Version 1.0 of the OFr Data System was piloted by 57 counties in 11 states from October 2020 through August 2021. Many additional OFr sites were interested in using the OFr Data System but had significant challenges with securing access to REDCap on their agencies' servers due to their technology staff members' limited capacity to support REDCap installation and maintenance.

OFr Data System pilot site users and OFr practitioners provided feedback on Version 1.0 to help improve and enhance the use, completeness, and capabilities of the OFr Data System to meet the field's needs. Version 2.0 was released in February 2022 after pilot site one-on-one interviews and over a dozen listening sessions. A crosswalk was developed for Version 1.0 pilot sites to upload data into Version 2.0. To address REDCap technology limitations, IIR

is hosting Version 2.0 on its REDCap server and supporting sites with ongoing OFr Data System and REDCap training and technical assistance.

### OFr Data System Access

OFr sites can access the OFr Data System by completing the [OFr Data System Registration](#). Sites will be able to designate if they want to access the OFr Data System on their agency's or IIRs REDCap server.

REDCap is a secure Web application for building and managing secure online surveys and databases. To use the OFr Data System onsite, your agency needs to have access to REDCap (Version 8.10.0 or later); otherwise you can use the IIR REDCap server free of charge.

### OFr Data System Access

OFr sites using their own REDCap will be provided the OFr Data System REDCap projects to download and install on its secure network. The site can then begin entering data.

When possible, it is recommended that states with multiple OFrs host the OFr Data System on a state agency REDCap

server and create Data Access Groups (DAGs) for each local OFR team.

Sites that do not have REDCap on their network and do not have a state-hosted DAG can join the IIR OFR DAG on the IIR REDCap server for free. Registered users of the IIR OFR DAG need to sign a data use agreement (DUA) before getting access.
